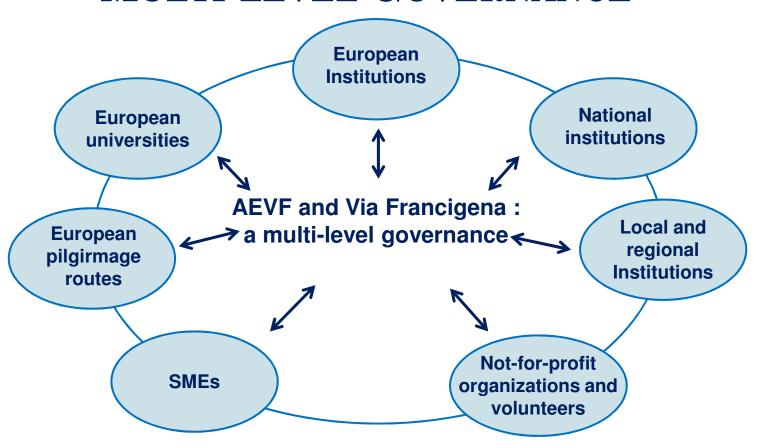

### THE VIA FRANCIGENA

- SINCE THE MIDDLE AGE AN ARTERIAL ROAD FROM NORTHERN EUROPE TO ROME, ONE OF THE SO-CALLED **PEREGRINATIONES MAJORES**, TOGETHER WITH SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA AND JERUSALEM PEREGRINATIONS'
- 1994: CERTIFICATION AWARDED BY THE COUNCIL OF EUROPE
- HISTORICAL BASE: THE ITINERARY DESCRIBED BY ARCHBISHOP SIGERIC IN HIS DIARY, IN AD 990, ON HIS WAY BACK TO CANTERBURY FROM ROME, WHERE HE HAD RECEIVED THE "PALLIUM" OR BISHOP'S CAPE FROM POPE JOHN XV. IN THIS DOCUMENT HE DESCRIBES 79 HALTES, "MANTIONES" OF HIS JOURNEY.

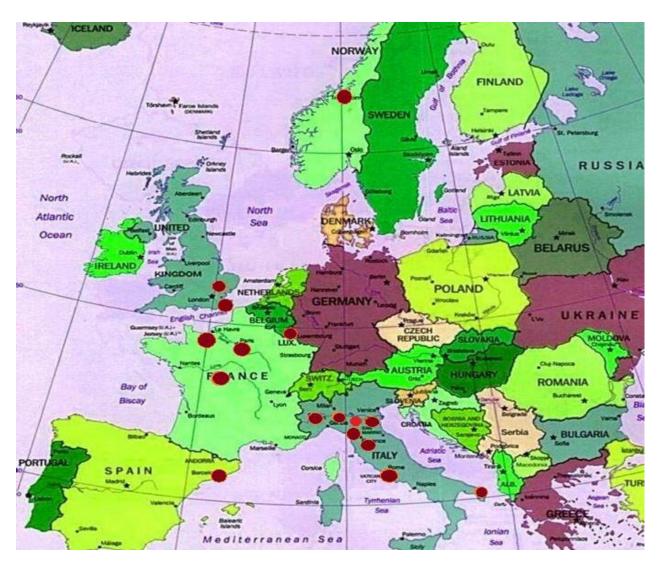
